Careers/University Focused Sessions – message for Year 12 from Mr Bridgwater

We have two careers focused support sessions being run on site by some fantastic external providers.

1) 28 April - My Uni Journey by PUSH. PUSH are a non-profit organisation that visits hundreds of schools and colleges each year to deliver interactive training sessions, with the objective to inspire, engage and inform 1,000s of young people on thinking (and getting excited) about the benefits of a higher education journey. The aim of the session is to explore what the university experience offers. As in-person open days aren't running at the moment, we think this offers a good alternative.

The session will last an hour and will start at 1.45pm - please see or email Mr Bridgwater to sign up as places are limited.

What to do if you access something disturbing or inappropriate online

We are aware of reports of disturbing and upsetting material online on sites such as TikTok and of students coming across such material by mistake. If you have seen inappropriate content online, you can:

- talk to a parent, carer, member of staff, another trusted adult or Childline if you are worried about something.
- avoid 'sharing explicit or inappropriate content you've seen online to raise awareness.
- report any inappropriate, illegal, explicit, identifying or distressing content to CEOP through their website.
- block any distressing, inappropriate or upsetting content on social media websites.

Sexual Abuse in Education: dedicated NSPCC helpline 0800 136 663

You are, I am sure, aware of the news reports about websites which have highlighted issues about sexual harassment and abuse by peers in schools. In response to this, the government have announced an immediate review with OFSTED and the NSPCC has launched a new dedicated helpline.

The NSPCC helpline has started taking calls. The helpline will provide both children and adults who are potential victims of sexual abuse in schools with the appropriate support and advice. This includes how to contact the police and report crimes if they wish. The helpline will also provide support to parents/carers and professionals too.
