Spring Term 1

Staying Safe: Students will explore the effects on people who use of alcohol, smoking and vaping, caffeine and drugs and the law regarding possession, supply, and use.

Health and Wellbeing: Students will explore what mental wellbeing and self-esteem are and how these can be affected by negative influences around us (e.g. social media and body image).

Spring 1

Health and Wellbeing: Students will explore the characteristics of mental wellbeing and the stigma sometimes attached to mental illness. They will learn to identify ways to promote their own emotional wellbeing and evaluate the positive and negative impact of social media on self-esteem and body image.

Relationships and Sex Education: Students will explore the thoughts, feelings and emotions a person might have when dealing with a loss such as a relationship breakdown or bereavement. They will learn about sources of support and ways to help a friend who is dealing with a loss.

Spring 1

Relationships and Sex Education: Students will explore the options available to people who wish to make a long-term commitment, including their legal rights. Students will discuss the different options for people wishing to start a family and identify the skills needed for successful parenting. Students will explore the options available in the event of an unintended pregnancy and the legal status of abortion.

Students will discuss the range of emotions felt when someone dies and will identify and evaluate ways of coping and supporting others. They will explore the issues around organ and tissue donation.

Relationships and Sex Education:

Students will explore how to effectively communicate their wants and needs in relationships. They will discuss how to handle unwanted attention both online and offline. They will explore the various forms of domestic abuse and how to seek help for themselves and others.

Students will explore the term 'honour' based violence and who is most at risk. They will identify what a forced marriage is and how it is distinguished from an arranged marriage or other form of legal marriage. They will discuss where and how to seek support if they are concerned about themselves or someone they know.

The NCS programme offers young people, aged 16-17, a once in a lifetime opportunity to do something meaningful with their summer break, as well as a chance to develop skills and take on new challenges that will set them up for adult life. We've seen first-hand what an amazing feeling of accomplishment and increased confidence this brings.

NCS is all about helping teenagers realise their potential by giving them a taste of independence and loading them up with new skills that set them up to achieve their future goals, whatever they may be. And this year, it's your teen's turn!

We will deliver an assembly at your teens school on Thursday 20th January and students will be provided with a 'register their interest' form. If your teen does want to register their interest in taking part in NCS this summer, we ask them to share your contact details. This is so that we can complete the administrative process required to get them signed up to a programme date. If they do let us know they are interested, we'll be in touch with you by email or phone to run through the steps we need to complete their booking.

Representatives from the NCS will also be available in the school library during lunchtime on Friday 21st January, to answer any questions students may have.

A place on NCS is worth around £1200 and we usually ask for a £50 contribution for our standard NCS programme. However, if your teen is eligible for pupil premium it can be as little as just £10.
