## **Pathways to the Professions**

Our Pathways programmes support disadvantaged students in **Year 12 – 13** to explore career opportunities in **Banking & Finance** (both in-person and online), **Consulting** (online), **Engineering** (in-person), **Law** (in-person and online), **Medicine** (in-person), and **Veterinary Medicine** (hybrid) <u>for</u> **free**.

#### **Access Apprenticeships**

High-quality apprenticeships not only offer young people the opportunity to earn while they learn but also ensure they gain valuable skills and get a foot on the career ladder.

Over a year, we will be offering students the opportunity to learn more about one of three different apprenticeship sectors: **Banking and Finance** (London based), **Engineering** (Manchester based), and **Law** (London based). They will need to live within commutable distance of the programme they are applying for.

### **Application details**

All costs including travel, accommodation, food and activities are covered by the Trust and our partners which means it is completely free of charge for students to attend.

### Who can apply?

To apply for the programme, they must:

- Attend, and have always attended, a state-funded, non-fee-paying school/college
- Be in **Year 12/S5** at the start of the programme.
- For in-person programmes, live within a **reasonable commuting distance of the university** they are applying to. Online programmes are available nationwide.

We prioritise students based on a range of <u>social mobility criteria</u> including eligibility for free school meals, and the context of their school and neighbourhood.
