Year 12 results will be given back during lessons once the exams have been marked for that subject area.

Professional Pathways Event Series (February Half Term)

What

We are hosting a series of events in February half term $(13^{th} - 15^{th})$ which are designed to provide year 13's with a completely unique insight into the world of Private Equity & Private Credit investing through meeting with a range of the top firms in the industry.

Why

Finance and banking internships have become so competitive that there is an expectation with employers that students have at least one Spring Week before 2nd year of University. We know that many students without a family background in finance do not have an awareness around Spring Weeks, and tend to miss out on applying in their first weeks on campus. Consequently, the barrier to entry within financial services remains high. This event has been designed as a Spring Week alternative (Spring Weeks are essential programmes which 1st year university students complete in

order to gain an internship in their 2nd year), meaning that those who attend the Professional Pathways Events will already be one step ahead of their peers when it comes to applying for professional experience when they get to campus in September.

Who

This event is for current year 13 students who are curious about a career in finance or who are working towards studying a STEM, Economics or Finance focused university course. The event is also suitable for <u>alumni</u> from your school who are currently in 1st or 2nd year of university. How

These events will be held in the City of London, and all travel costs and catering will be covered via the Foundation (meaning the events are accessible to all). The Event series will be run over three days and will offer an in-depth insight and networking opportunity for students to develop their understanding of three areas of finance. Students can choose to attend between one and three events, depending on their interests.. The series will be run as follows:

- Tuesday 13th February Insight into Private Credit Investing
- Wednesday 14th February Insight into Public Markets Investing
- Thursday 15th February Insight into Private Equity Investing

Property Insight day Cambridge – 13th march

We are running a Real Estate Insight day in <u>Cambridge</u> on <u>13th March</u> in order to help students discover more about careers within the property Industry.

Students will go on a site visit, work on a small project and have a Q&A session with both current and recent Real Estate graduates who are now working in the Industry. They will also be assisting students throughout the day. The day will be fully funded by Pathways2property including travel costs to and from the venue.

Applications can be found <u>here</u> on our website here and will close on <u>15th February.</u> Priority will be given to those students that live in the Cambridge area and fit within our <u>criteria</u>.

Students that have attended any one of our programmes will subsequently be able to take part in our <u>work experience</u> and <u>e-mentoring programme</u> and they will also be able to apply for a <u>bursary of up to £30,000</u> should they go on to study a property related degree at any University. If they apply to study a Real Estate course at the University of Reading they will be <u>guaranteed a contextual offer</u> and will automatically be given £2500 once enrolled.

We are a charity funded by the Real Estate Industry who are keen to support students from less advantaged and non-traditional backgrounds. In the 10 years we have been running we have engaged with over 26,400 students - 22% of attendees of our Summer school have since gone on to study or work in property.
