Academic Reading

This has been launched this week with year 12 students. The benefits of academic reading have been shared during tutor time and all year 12 students should have selected their first book from one of their 3 subject areas. - -Eligible for Free School Meals
- -Seeking asylum, or with refugee status
- -Household(s) in receipt of Universal Credit
- -Financial hardship

To apply for a funded place students should complete a short form and include a supporting statement from their school or college with an authorised stamp or signature.
