VetCam 2025 – Introduction to Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University Monday 7th, Tuesday 8th and Wednesday 9th April 2025

Following the successful courses held here in recent years, we are holding another two-and-a-half-day residential programme for Year 11 and 12 students interested in applying to study Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University.

The programme will include visits to both the pre-clinical and clinical departments to give a taste of the course, insight into life at a Cambridge college, and a chance to meet staff and current students. Places will be limited to 50 on a first-come-first-served basis. Please note that Chemistry A level (or equivalent) is mandatory (with A*/A predictions), and we strongly recommend two other science subjects, normally Biology, Physics or Maths.

The 2025 course fee will be £340 for the all-inclusive two-and-a-half-day course – this fee covers all costs whilst attendees are in Cambridge. Attendees will be staying in St Catharine's College in single student rooms with shared bathrooms.
