Year 12 exam week

On these two dates the year group who are not in an assembly should be onsite and carrying out independent study/revision.

General expectations

The start of a new term is always a good opportunity to give a reminder around the general expectations in the Sixth Form.

- Sixth form starts at 8.40am every morning with tutor time this is a compulsory element to your timetable, as is Tuesday period 1 which is when our assemblies take place.
- Mobile phones/air pods you should not have phones out during a lesson or during tutor
 time unless there is a particular reason that your teacher/tutor has instructed you to use if
 for. This also includes if you go over to the main school at any time. We encourage you to put
 your phone away during independent study time.
- Signing in and out please make sure you are signing in and out anytime you are leaving the site and when you return.
- Please make sure you are using the student entrance to the Sixth Form. Students should not be going through the main reception.
- Lanyards these should be worn and visible at all times.

Year 13 key messages

It was great to see so many of you attending the revision sessions during the first week of the Easter holiday. I hope you found them useful.

Year 13 students will be given the opportunity to start **study leave on Monday 12 May**. There will be a **leavers assembly** the week before this date during the usual period one assembly slot on **Tuesday 6th May** for all year 13 students.

Please remember that lessons will continue to run until the final exam has taken place in that subject area.

Individual students will be contacted to discuss alternative study plans if there are concerns and/or all certain criteria has not been met. Subject teachers will ask some individual students to continue attending lessons/masterclasses within their subject and students should make arrangements to attend these unless there is an exam clash.

You can also continue to use school facilities during study leave if they wish to and can of course still contact teachers for support. As we need to know who is on site for safeguarding reasons, it is important that students **sign in and out** if they are in to study or attend lessons.

Before the 12th May year 13 students are still expected to attend tutor time where the focus will be on revison and exam preparation. Individual tutorials will also continue over the next couple of weeks. During study leave your tutors will still be avaliable every morning for any students who wish to meet with them for any required support.

As we approach exam season for Year 13's please can you start to think about returning any library books, academic reading, or subject textbooks with which you have finished. Books can be returned to Mrs Millbank in the library, left in the blue box on the library desk or on the trolley by the main entrance doors to the library. A-Level Revision sessions - Biology and Chemistry (Lincolnshire training hub)

They will be held on Zoom between 6 and 7:30pm.

Tuesday 6th May: A-Level Biology – Liver, Kidney + The Heart. Wednesday 7th May: Chemistry – Analysis Techniques.

These sessions are free and will be first come first serve. Please fill in the provided form, and we will send across the log in information closer to the time.

Two individual sessions taught by current medical students and doctors to help prospective healthcare students reach the top grades. Each session includes revision tips, breaking down exam questions and topics recommended by previous feedback.

Tuesday 6th May: Biology – Liver, Kidney + The Heart: Learn about three of the body's organs, their function, how they can go wrong, and major marking points. Also including medicine links to the content, including common diseases, to help you remember the content more by applying it to real life.

Wednesday 7th May: Chemistry – Analysis Techniques: Including Infrared Spectroscopy, Mass Spectroscopy, Proton NMR, Carbon NMR and how to tackle those big mark questions at the end of the organic paper. Including links to how we use these techniques within medicine.
